INTRODUCTION

Domestic violence is the willful intimidation, physical assault, battery, sexual assault, and/or other abusive behavior as part of a systematic pattern of power and control perpetrated by one intimate partner against another. It includes physical violence, sexual violence, threats, and emotional abuse. The frequency and severity of domestic violence can vary dramatically. On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. During one year, this equates to more than 10 million women and men.

What We Do

Domestic Violence Project helps
Suffolk County survivors of domestic
violence in family law matters,
including obtaining orders of
protection, custody and support. An
order of protection (OP) is a paper
from a judge that makes rules about
contact between people. An OP can
be either a "Refrain From" OP,
meaning an order to stop abusing,
harassing, or threatening the person
OR a "Stay Away" OP, meaning an
order to stay away from the person
entirely, move out of shared home,
and/or limit communication.
