ADVOCACY TIPS FOR MAY

ONE

Student Loan Tip! Are you in default on your *federal* student loans? There are two primary ways to get out of default.

- <u>Rehabilitation.</u> Make nine monthly payments in full and on time over a ten-month period. You must call your loan servicer to start this process. *Caution: You can only rehabilitate your loans one time.*
- <u>Consolidation</u>. You get a new loan to pay off your defaulted loan, which cures the default. You will then be required to make payments according to the terms of your new loan. You can apply for consolidation online with your FSA ID through the Department of Education's <u>website</u>. *Caution: Consolidating your loans may result in* the loss of certain benefits available to you prior to default.

Nassau Suffolk Law Services is a participating agency in the EDCAP (Education Debt Consumer Assistance Program) Network. EDCAP helps New Yorkers navigate the student loan system regardless of the type of education debt, federal or private. EDCAP offers free, one-on-one counseling with our student loan experts who only have your best interests at heart. Nassau Suffolk Law Services can also assist when a defendant is being sued on a higher education debt matter. TWO

Attention Veterans! In January 2023, the Supreme Court held that there is a firm oneyear timeframe for military veterans to apply for retroactive service-connected disability benefits, and cannot be extended even when the veteran is not at fault for missing the deadline. Veterans who have a service-connected disability should apply for benefits within one year of leaving the service.

Nassau Suffolk Law Services Veterans Rights Project provides legal assistance to lowincome United States military veterans. Legal services include assistance with various issues including veteran's benefits and appeals, discharges, upgrades, public benefits, landlord-tenant matters, consumer debt issues, select social security appeals, and family law matters. The family law matter assistance provided focuses on child support and excludes divorces, custody, and visitation. Suffolk residents can call 631-232-2400 Nassau residents can call 516-292-8100.

THREE

Public Benefits Alert! As of May 12th, 2023, the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) updated its policy pertaining to non-citizens who are considered permanently residing under color of law (PRUCOL). Individuals eligible under this new update may be eligible for Safety Net Assistance (SNA). NSLS' Public Benefits Unit provides legal assistance to persons who experience problems with public benefits programs that are administered by the local Departments of Social Services, including:

- Welfare (TANF and Safety Net)
- Medicaid
- Food Stamps (SNAP)
- Child Care Assistance
- HEAP
- Emergency shelter for the homeless
- Unemployment insurance appeals and overpayments
- Other emergency assistance programs

We also assist low-income households in establishing Supplemental Needs Trusts to eliminate the Medicaid spend-down and assist homeless families to obtain rent supplements from DSS to enable families to leave the shelters or retain permanent housing. FOUR

The Public Health Emergency Has Ended! New York State has begun the process of resuming annual renewals for Medicaid, Child Health Plus, and the Essential Plan. Anyone covered by these public coverage programs anytime beginning March 2020 has stayed covered through continuous coverage. The federal government has directed states to resume renewals beginning April 2023. Some New Yorkers began receiving renewal packets in March 2023, and everyone will receive them over the next year. The first date enrollees can lose coverage if they do not renew or if they are no longer eligible is July 1, 2023. Please see the fact sheet from Medicaid Matters New York for some helpful tips.

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FIVE

ATTENTION! Town of Hempstead, Town of Oyster Bay, and the OTDA ERAP portals are CLOSED and not expected to reopen. OTDA (Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance) is currently processing eligible ERAP (Emergency Rental Assistance Program) applications submitted through the closing date of January 20th, 2023, *including applications from subsidized housing tenants whose rent is limited to a certain percentage of income (including public housing, section 8 and FHEPS)*. This means that if a tenant submitted an ERAP application through OTDA *before* January 20th, 2023, then OTDA will be denying or approving the application soon. Eviction proceedings should be stayed (temporarily stopped) if there is a pending ERAP application until there is a final decision including going through any appeals process. The Town of Islip has a separate portal where residents can apply, however, this portal is currently closed. See the information below. If you receive a decision on your ERAP application that you disagree with, make sure to appeal within thirty (30) days by calling 844-691-7368 or filling out the OTDA <u>online application form</u>.

OTHER RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Suffolk and Nassau County DSS- The Department of Social Services has programs available to provide help with receiving shelter or rent arrears to prevent homelessness. Nassau Suffolk Law Services, in partnership with Empire Justice Center, can now assist Nassau and Suffolk residential tenants with housing-related legal problems (like eviction) and a household income of up to 80% of the Area Median Income. Services are available through this partnership regardless of immigration status. Please call the office closest to you to see if you are eligible for legal services. Interpreters are available. This presentation gave an overview of when the Social Security Administration determines that a client does not qualify for SSDI or SSI resulting in an overpayment to the government. We discussed basic information about the SSDI and SSI programs, the income and resource limits for


